SBMA Chairman and Administrator Wilma T. Fisma formally handed over

tor Wilma T. Eisma formally handed over the donations consisting of a school-house and a healthcare clinic to officials of the Ambala Ayta Tribe of Pastolan,

whose ancestral lands form part of the Subic Bay Freeport Zone.

Eisma said the donated infrastructures are part of the agency's commitment under a Joint Management Agreement signed by the SBMA, the Ayta tribe, and the National Commission an Indigenous Bearle (NCIP) that pro-

Ayta tribe, and the National Commission on Indigenous People (NCIP) that provides compensation for the use of part of the Ayta ancestral domain.

The health clinic is expected to serve the 330 families living in the Ayta village, while the school building will be used by students in Grades 4 to 6.


"I will do everything I can to give what is rightfully yours under the agreement," Eisma told the Ayta community led by Chieffain Conrado Frenilla during

# Tahong back in Bataan markets

SAMAL, Bataan -- Green mussels or "tahong" were again sold in Bataan markets on Saturday after the shellfish ban due to red tide was lifted on Thursday.

"Ngayon okay na, wala nang red tide sa Bataan. Maraming salamat (Now, it is already okay. There is no more red tide in Bataan. Thank you very much)," said Clarissa Boyo, tahong vendor in a makeshift stall in

She said that one "gallon" of "ta-hong" and oysters or "talaba" costs PHP100. She said oysters will be available on Sunday. 'Ńakaka-miss kumain ng tahong. Paborito ito ng mga anak ko (We missed eating tahong. This is my children's favorite)," Rina Saldana said while buying the shellfish.

The Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) issued a shellfish advisory on February 7 that the coastal waters in the towns of Orani, Samal, Abucay, Pilar, Orion, Limay, and Mariveles and the City of Balanga were already free from the red tide toxin.

Samples gathered from the area for three consecutive weeks were found negative for paralytic shellfish poison.

With the advisory, the harvesting, gathering and marketing of shellfish in Bataan are now permitted as marine bivalve products are already safe for human con-

On November 24 last year, BFAR issued a shellfish ban due to the presence of red tide in Bataan. (PNA)

### Measles in Central Luzon kills 6, infects 437

CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, Pampanga -- A Department of Health (DOH) epidemiologist said Friday measles cases in Central Luzon spiked significantly as 96 percent of the affected children in the region were unvacci-

"More children suffered the disease because their parents refused to bring them to health centers to avail of free vaccines," Dr. Jesse Fantone, head of DOH's Regional Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (RESU) told the Philippine News Agency (PNA) in a

Data from the DOH-RESU showed a total of 437 cases and six deaths reported in Central Luzon from January 1 to February 7 this year, compared to only 32 cases with no death during the same period last year.

Of the seven provinces in Central Luzon, Bulacan has the highest number of measles cases with 144, followed by Pampanga with 136; Tarlac with 89; Bataan with 27; Zambales with 23; and Nueva Ecija with 18. The province of Aurora had no measles

Of the six deaths, three were from Pampanga and one each in Bulacan, Bataan,

Regional health officials declared a measles outbreak in Central Luzon on Thurs-

Fantone said the Dengvaxia scare is a minor reason why parents have failed to participate in the immunization program.

"Some of the parents reasoned out that they were busy and (that they live) far from the health centers. Thus, we have been

doing a house-to-house immunization campaign," he said.

The health official said that the DOH has been conducting an outbreak response immunization in areas in the region where clustering of measles cases were reported since April last year.

He said this is aside from the measles routine immunization being conducted every Wednesday in all health centers of the region

"Thus, I am appealing to parents to have their children vaccinated against this in-fectious disease," Fantone said as he assured that the DOH regional office has a sufficient supply of vaccines that could be availed of for free.

Likewise, he asked the local government officials and other stakeholders to help them in this campaign.

"This measles outbreak can be controlled. Let us stand to protect our children.

trolled. Let us stand to protect our children. Please help us inform the public that measles can be prevented through vaccination," he added.

Babies from six to eight months old are immunized with the measles and rubella vaccine, while children nine months to four years old are given the measles, mumps and rubella vaccine.

Measles is a highly infectious and communicable disease caused by a virus. Symptoms and calde high fever, cough, conjunctivitis and colds.

If not properly managed, it can lead to complications, such as blindness, encephalitis, pneumonia, diarrhea and even death.

# Marine F-35B Lightning II fighters strike with externally-mounted ordnance

USS WASP, Philippine Sea – F-35B Lightning II aircraft with the fixed-wing detachment of Medium Marine Tiltrotor

Squadron 262 (Reinforced), 31st Marine Expeditionary Unit, conducted milestone flight operations with externally-loaded inert and live ordnance in expeditionary strike training from the USS Wasp (LHD 1) in the Philippine and East China Seas, Jan. 26 through Feb. 6.

During the missions, the fifth-generation fighters were loaded with CATM-9X air-to-air missiles and dropped inert and high-explosive munitions with precision Guided Bomb Units, including 500-pound GBU-12 Paveway II and 1,000-pound GBU-

32 Joint Direct Attack Munztion ordnance, according to LtCol. Michael Rountree, the F-35B detachment officer-in-charge with

VMM-262 (REIN).

"We achieved mission success by using the full capabilities of the F-35B at sea. We flew sorties in both a clean configuration and a configuration with external pylons andweapons. We conduct ed these missions by launching from the USS Wasp, engaging role-player adversary aircraft, striking simulated targets with internally and externally mounted precision guided munitions, returning to the Wasp, and recovering via a vertical landing - a niche capability of the F-35B" said Rountree. "This was the first time that this level of training has been performed by an operationally-deployed F-35B detachment with the 31st MEU.

This operational milestone marks the first time that F-35B aircraft performed strikes with ordnance fully- loaded in the Indo-Pacific region, demonstrating an increase in lethality and integrated amphibious capability, according to Col. Robert Brodie, commanding officer of the 31st

The combination of stealth tactics and fully-loaded strike aircraft increases the lethálity of the F-35B, enabling greater contribution and combat effectiveness by the Amphibious Ready Group/Marine Expeditionary Unit Team," said Brodie, a career F/A-18 Hornet pilot. "The formidable and versatile capability of the F-35B provides a premier platform to support the Marine Air-Ground Task Force's ability to own the fight in the dynamic and evolving

Indo-Pacific environment."

Supreme Court in the case Hacienda Luisita, Inc. (HLI) versus Presidential Agrarian Reform Council (PARC), the policy-making body of the Comprehensive Agrarian Reform Program.

In the decision, the high court declared the validity of PARC Resolution No. 2005-32-01 dated December 22, 2005 which revoked the Stock Distribution Option Agreement between HLI and the farmers or farm workers citing certain violations in the provisions of the agreement.

Subsequent resolutions of the court also affirmed the resolution of the PARC mandating the immediate distribution of agricultural lands within Hacienda Luisita. (CLJD-PIA 3)

# All-Female Flyover for Naval Aviation Pioneer Capt. Mariner

NORFOLK, Virginia (NNS) -- Honoring the life and legacy of a female pioneer in Naval aviation, the U.S. Navy will conduct Feb. 2 the first ever all-female flyover in Maynardville, Tennessee. Officially referred to as a "Missing Man Flyover," the tribute will be part of the funeral service for one of the Navy's first female jet pilots retired Navy Contain Poscomer. Mark lots retired Navy Captain Rosemary Mariner, who passed away Jan. 24 following a long and brave fight with cancer.

After completing flight training in 1974, Mariner was designated a naval aviator and received her Wings of Gold to became the Navy's first female jet pilot flying the A-4E/L "Skyhawk" and the A-7E "Corsair II."

She also was the first female military aviator to achieve command of an operational air squadron. During Operation Desert Storm, Mariner command-

Mariner retired from the U.S.

Navy in 1997 after obtaining the rank of

captain and logging seventeen carrier arrested landings, or "traps," and completing over 3,500 flight hours in 15 different

The Missing Man Flyover is a special tribute honoring the service of aviators who have died serving their country. The maneuver features four aircraft flying above the funeral service in formation as one of the aircraft leaves the formation and climbs vertically into the heavens

All of the female aviators participating in the flyover are from squadrons based at Naval Air Station (NAS) Oceana and will be flying F/A-18E/F "Super Hornets." The event is significant because it is emblematic of the growing role wom-

en play in the military.

The flyover is especially meaningful to Lt. Emily Rixey, assigned to Strike Fighter Weapons School Atlantic, a

participant in the commemoration.

"I find it important to honor Capt. Mariner and the other female aviators who have come before us," she said.
"They paved the way for us and they're the reason I'm able to participate in this flyover."

Cmdr. Leslie Mintz, executive officer of Strike Fighter Squadron (VFA) 213, expressed similar sentiments.

"I'm truly honored and humbled to be a part of this flyover," Mintz said. "This formation flyover is a great way to honor Capt. Mariner's memory and what she has done for our community.

Lt. Cmdr. Paige Blok, a naval aviator with VFA-32, echoes her colleagues' statements.

"Honoring a life of service is always a privilege," said Blok. "We're lucky to honor." Capt. Mariner in our own spe-
